1 OF A SUIT AND A 2NT REBID = 18-19	10-15 POINTS = 3NT
2NT = 20 − 21 &	16-17 POINTS = 4NT
2C – 2D 2NT = 22-24	18-19 POINTS = 6NT
3NT = 25-26	20 -21 POINTS = 5NT
2C – 2D	22 + POINTS =7NT

3NT = 27-28

SOME ASSUMPTIONS

- YOU PLAY STAYMAN **2C** ASKS FOR A **4-CD MAJOR**
- YOU PLAY TRANSFERS **2D** TRANSFERS TO **2H 2H** TRANSFERS TO **2S**
- ALSO, TEXAS TRANSFERS 4D TRANSFERS TO 4H 4H TRANSFERS TO 4S
- YOU PLAY GERBER WHERE **4C** ASKS FOR **ACES**

NOW A COUPLE OF DEFINITIONS

4NT

- Is called QUANTITATIVE when it is used as a raise of NT- it invites a slam if the opener is at the top of their bid. IT IS NOT ASKING FOR ACES!
- SO: After partner opens 1NT your bid of 4NT asks the opener to pass with 15 and to bid 6NT with 17. With 16 partner tends to bid 6NT.
- We will explore other uses of this important bid.

5NT

Is called "**PICK A SLAM**". After 1NT is opened it asks the opener to bid 7NT if he is on the top of his bid. Otherwise, he is to bid 6NT.

So: If the opener has 15 points, he bids 6NT and with 17 he bids 7NT. With 16 you would be cautious about bidding the grand.

We will explore other uses of this important bid.

ONE MORE DEFINITION

GERBER

GERBER is used as an ace asking bid after 1NT or 2NT is bid as a natural bid. Gerber is always a jump!! **4C** asks and the answers are:

4D = 0 or 4 4H = 1 4S = 2 4NT= 3

We will look at another use of the important convention.

What happened to our asking bid after a transfer?

ASKING AFTER A TRANSFER

• Because we also play Texas Transfer –

THERE IS NO ASKING BID AFTER A SIMPLE ACCEPTANCE OF OUR 2-LEVEL TRANSFER.

So how do we ask? 1NT - 4D 1NT - 4H (Texas Transfers) 4H - 4NT 4S - 4NT (ASKING)

So: What is this1NT - 2D1NT - 2D1NT - 2H1NT - 2H2H - 4H2H - 4C2S - 4S2S - 4D

A SPLINTER (singleton or void in clubs/diamonds) showing 6-card major and inviting slam.

CAN WE EVER ASK AFTER A 2-LEVEL TRANSFER?


- YES IN TWO SPECIFIC SITUATIONS
- FIRST: Partner super-accepts our transfer:
 - 1NT 2H
 - 3S 4NT
- SECOND: We transfer and then bid a second suit and partner shows 3card support and a good hand: **3 STRONGER THAN 4**.
 - 1NT 2H
 - 2S 3C
 - 3S 4NT

HOW DO THESE PRINCIPLES APPLY AFTER 2NT?

This discussion applies to 2NT after either a direct 2NT opening or after 2C is opened and the opener rebids 2NT

REMEMBER – **4C** IS NOT GERBER (ASKING) IT IS A SUIT!!!

SO

IF THESE NEW ASKING BIDS AND THE ANSWERS ARE TOO HARD AND YOU THINK YOU HAVE SLAM – JUST BID IT!!!



4H – 4NT	45 – 4NT


4NT IS ASKING SINCE THE OPENER JUMPED WITHOUT THE JUMP **4NT** WOULD BE **QUANTITATIVE**







